Frequently Asked Questions

WHO

The Grand Lodge of British Columbia and Yukon has recognized the need to promote civility in our society. With the support of the National Civility Center, Freemasons are asked to demonstrate to others how to act in a civil manner in all our dealings.

The National Civility Center Board of Directors is comprised of several Freemasons, most notably MW Bro Don Stutt for our Grand Lodge and MW Bro. Russ Charvonia PGM of California. RW Bro. Ron Yates and RW Bro. Barry Burch are members of the National Civility Center Task Force.

British Columbia and Yukon is the only grand jurisdiction in Canada supporting this programme, at this point, joining twelve other Grand Lodges in the USA.

TITLE

The Freemasons Civility Initiative supported by British Columbia and Yukon Freemasons. It is hoped that all Freemasons throughout the jurisdiction will take up the cause.

WHEN

Commencing in January 2017 a civility presentation will be offered to lodges in our jurisdiction. In May 2017 we will be promoting *May is Civility Month* in British Columbia and Yukon. Details on *May is Civility Month* will be made available in March 2017

Brethren are encouraged to engage their family and friends by demonstrating our masonic way of life that essentially exemplifies civility.

WHAT

Freemasons, demonstrating civility in their daily lives and in their dealings with others sets an example for others to follow. This idea has spread to a dozen states and, with British Columbia and Yukon, is now in Canada. We hope to spread the word in our jurisdiction.

WHY

Civility is essential for the success of any society. It is grounded in respect and in an attitude of inclusiveness. When we practice it we remind ourselves about the impact of our actions on others while contributing to the well being of our family, community and society at large.
